



GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING ABSTRACTS OF PAPERS

1st International Congress and 4th Argentine Congress on Cannabis & Health

Submission Deadline: July 10, 2026

IMPORTANT: Once you have completed your registration using the [form](#), you are eligible to submit your paper.

The registration fee for submitting a paper includes admission to all three days of the Conference and Expo. Submitted abstracts must follow the writing guidelines outlined below and pertain to one of the proposed thematic areas:

THEMATIC AREAS:

- 1.- Advances in basic research on Medicinal Cannabis.
- 2.- Cannabis and Health: Clinical studies and patient support experiences involving humans and non-humans.
- 3.- Production and technological developments.
- 4.- Public policies. Public health and Cannabis.
- 5.- Social and legal processes.
- 6.- Education. University and Cannabis.
- 7.- Social economy and cooperativism.



GUIDELINES FOR PREPARING THE ABSTRACT:

Abstracts may be submitted on three types of paper: Scientific Work, Case Report, and Systematization of Experiences. (for instructions, see “Abstract” bullet point)

The work can be submitted in Spanish, Portuguese, or English. Prepare your abstract in a Word document, formatted in Times New Roman, size 12, with the following structure:

- **THEMATIC AREA:** Indicate the congress area that best fits your work.
- **PRESENTATION PREFERENCE:** Specify your preference for ORAL or POSTER presentation. Final assignment is at the discretion of the Scientific Committee.
- **TITLE:** Keep it concise and reflective of the content. No period at the end. Below, include the title in English if different, formatted in Times New Roman, size 12, bold.
- **AUTHORS:** List full names with contact emails. Separate each author with a comma. Use superscript numbers to indicate institutional affiliations. The first author will present the work. Format as follows: For authors' names, use Times New Roman, 12, regular. For affiliations, use Times New Roman, 10, regular.
- **ABSTRACT:** Maximum extension of 2800 characters, including spaces. No section titles are necessary, but if used, format in the same font and underline, followed by a colon. Format: Times New Roman, 12, regular, no first line indentation, justified. Abstracts belonging to the **Scientific Work** category must include the following: introduction, hypothesis and objectives, materials and methods, results and conclusion. For a **Case Report** abstract, include: introduction, case description, treatment plan, developments, results and conclusions. If the abstract belongs to the **Systematization of Experiences** * category, bear in mind that: Systematization involves reflecting on the nature of the action, how actors understand it, its consequences, and the context, so as to inform future actions. (See below, section on Systematization of Experiences).
- **KEYWORDS:** Include 3 (three) to 6 (six) terms that define or identify your research content.



EVALUATION:

Abstracts will be evaluated by a Scientific Committee through a double-blind process to determine acceptance and presentation format (oral or poster). Authors may indicate their preferred presentation type in the submission; however, the final decision rests with the Scientific Committee. Authors will be notified in due course of their work's acceptance and presentation details.

Accepted abstracts will be compiled into the Abstract Book of the 1st International Congress and 4th Argentine Congress on Cannabis and Health. The Scientific Committee will award the best submissions.

Additionally, selected works may be published in full in the journal Cannabis and Health (www.cannabissalud.org)

IMPORTANT: Abstracts without results or with statements like "results will be discussed" will not be accepted, nor those exceeding the character limit.

SUBMISSION: The abstract can be submitted via the registration form or by email, after registering on the form.

Send your abstract as a Word document named with the thematic area code, "TC" for Scientific Work, "RC" for Case Report or "SE" for Systematization of Experiences, the first author's last name, and the congress abbreviation (e.g. for an abstract about thematic area 1, *Advances in basic research on Medicinal Cannabis*, the Word document must be named: A1-TC-SMITH-CyS2026). For a quicker review process, in case you send your abstract by email, write the same filename in the email subject. Following the former example, the email subject should be: "A1-TC-SMITH-CyS2026." You will receive a confirmation email upon receipt. A personalized decision regarding your manuscript will be sent later.

(*) For Systematization of Experiences: Systematization is a conceptual, analytical, and critical reflection of lived experiences, aiming to produce knowledge and identify challenges and transformational lines. Thus, it seeks to account for the meanings of the process developed, the factors involved, its relevance in a broader social and institutional context, the academic concepts that underpin it, the perception of its actors, and its achievements. It is, therefore, an analysis of a reality that has already occurred and been experienced. It can be retrospective or prospective, analyzing past events to propose future directions. The description should include sources of reconstruction, utilizing quantitative and/or qualitative data.
